

Itinerary Changes

Atlantis Events and Royal Caribbean International have carefully planned this cruise itinerary for your enjoyment. Although we do our best to adhere to published ports and times, both weather and sea conditions may force us to alter the itinerary during the cruise.

In the unlikely event of an itinerary change while sailing, we will communicate our new plan both through ship-wide (outside of cabin) announcements, on the ship's video screens, and through an updated *Cruise Compass*. Neither Atlantis nor Royal Caribbean shall be held liable for any damages resulting from any itinerary change according to your Cruise Ticket Contract.

Get Organized

Register Online and Book Shore Excursions Now

We recommend that you take a few minutes to register online for this cruise to obtain a full copy of your cruise documents from Royal Caribbean. You may also create a *SetSail* pass at this time that will allow you to check in quickly and board in just minutes. Please visit the following link by February 2 to register:

There is also a link on the www.atlantisevents.com site. You will need both your RCCL Reservation Number, and your passport number to register. Please note that the RCCL Reservation Number is different from the Atlantis Confirmation Number. You should have received this number by email from us if your booking is complete.

You may also reserve show tickets, make spa reservations for the port days, and book shore excursions at this time from the same site.

Review Your Travel Documents

No paper documentation is required to board this cruise since all records are stored electronically. All you need is your passport and a valid credit card for incidentals. A copy of your cruise ticket may be downloaded from the Royal Caribbean website once you have registered for your cruise. Luggage tags are shipped directly by US mail from the cruise line to US and Canadian guests who registered before January 23rd. Place one of the luggage tags on each of your checked bags prior to arrival at the pier. Additional luggage tags will be available at the pier.

Please review your Atlantis voucher to be sure you are booked correctly for all elements of your vacation. Also note that your acceptance of both the Atlantis Travel Voucher and the RCCL Passenger Cruise Contract constitutes acceptance of the conditions contained therein.

Documentation Requirements

A valid passport is preferred, and required for all guests from outside the USA. Proof of citizenship in the form of an original birth certificate and a government issued photo ID is acceptable for US citizens only. Visas are not required for citizens of the US and Canada. Visa requirements for all other nationalities vary and should be checked with the embassy or consulate of each country visited on your itinerary.

Please note that it is your responsibility to have the necessary documentation before boarding the ship. Failure to provide proper and valid documentation will result in denied boarding, and no refund will be provided.

Packing Advice

On Board Clothing

Atlantis emphasizes a casual, comfortable atmosphere with no specified dress code. Sportswear and casual resort attire are appropriate at all times. There are no formal nights, and absolutely no need for a jacket and tie.

Our only real rule is that no tank tops or shorts are permitted in any of the specialty restaurants at dinner. Please respect this rule for our premium dining experiences for all guests. The staff at these restaurants will ask you to change.

On Shore Clothing

Plan for warm, even hot weather with some cooler breezes at night. We recommend loose, comfortable cottons or other lightweight clothing. And don't forget a hat! All ports are casual with a beach-friendly attitude. We suggest beachwear and some really comfortable shoes. Some tours involve bus rides and/or considerable walking so comfort is essential.

Allure Party Themes

Our theme parties might warrant something special, but these, of course, are always optional. You'll be comfortable with or without an outfit. All listed events are outdoors, in the Solarium at night and Aqua Theater during the day..

- Hero Be one, imitate one, honor one, or just show up as a gushing fan. It's a party to
 celebrate the heroes of all worlds, from super to civic, ordinary to extraordinary, magical
 to mischievous, and everything in between. Ordinary dressed hero worshippers and
 onlookers welcome!
- Lost Continent There once was a mighty island nation, lying in front of the pillars of Heracles, so powerful that its warriors conquered nations before sinking into the ocean in a single day and night of misfortune. That utopian continent was known as Atlantis, of course, and tonight we return to that magical, mystical island where everything is beautiful and anything goes. Dress for conquering, primitive warrior, body-painted entertainer, undersea creature, or a simple tourist lost in the woods.
- Angels & Demons Atlantis' classic White Party develops a split personality as we hold a mirror up to the blazing purity of our most famous night. The Solarium becomes a place for Angels and all things white, pure, and fantastical. Descend into Studio B for a look at the other side and the mischievous dark world of Demons. Of course, sometimes you really can't tell which is which. Dress white to start, of course, and let the rest just happen.
- **Revival! Classic Disco T-Dance** The spirit of the 70s lives for two brief hours in the afternoon. Artificial fabrics, excess facial hair, and obnoxious chains welcome.
- **Final Rinse T-Dance** We'll clean it all up with a splash at our final T-dance! Simple, bright, and colorful, from pareos to shorts, leftover designer sunglasses, or that swimsuit you keep meaning to wear.

Miscellaneous Packing Advice

Bring plenty of sunblock, as the sun can be deceptively intense. Also, bring your own basic toiletries as the onboard stores are not open when in port.

Plan for uncertainty. Pack at least one change of clothes in your carry on bags in case your bags are lost or mishandled en route.

And we'll say it one more time --- don't put your passport in your checked luggage!

Prohibited Items

Please do not bring any of the following onboard, and do not place these items in your checked luggage: Irons (including travel irons), alcoholic beverages, knives, firearms, and any other potentially dangerous item.

If your luggage contains any of the above items, your bag will be held at security and will not be delivered to your stateroom. Full details on prohibited items can be found in Royal Caribbean's Guest Conduct Policy.

Getting Ready

Weather Forecast

February weather in the Caribbean is usually very pleasant and warm. You can expect high temperatures around $85^{\circ}F/27^{\circ}C$ and lows around $70 F/20^{\circ}C$. Rain is always a possibility, but we do our best to avoid it. It will feel cooler onboard the ship due to wind.

Money Matters

Every port we visit accepts US Dollars, as well as local currency. There is no need to exchange money on this cruise. If you plan on making any major purchases, use a credit card to get the best exchange rate.

Baggage

Most airlines now charge for checked luggage, so plan accordingly. Check with your carrier for specific allowances. The standard limit is 50 lbs. per piece. Excess or overweight bags may incur a substantial surcharge.

Do not place any valuables, especially your passport, in checked luggage. If you do so, it is at your own risk. Always keep your hand luggage with you.

Please be sure each piece of luggage has a tag listing your name and complete address. Upon arrival at the pier, please make sure your bag it tagged with your stateroom number and name. If you did not receive luggage tags in the mail, there will be plenty at the pier.

What if the Airlines Lose My Luggage?

If your luggage does not arrive in Ft. Lauderdale with you, please do all of the following:

- 1. Get a complete report from the airline, including a receipt and tracking number for your luggage. Make sure that you tell the airline that you are boarding Royal Caribbean's *Allure of the Seas*, and tell them that the ship sails at 5:00 pm.
- 2. Upon arrival on the ship, go immediately to the main reception where they will make a copy of your lost baggage report. The ship will attempt to track your luggage and follow up directly with the airlines.
- 3. Be patient. Depending on the airline it might arrive in Ft. Lauderdale. Our port agents, in concert with the ship, will attempt to deliver any lost luggage directly to your room. If your luggage does not arrive, they will keep you informed with the latest news from your airline.

Please realize that neither Royal Caribbean nor Atlantis has lost your luggage. We can only assist you in recovering your luggage from the airline and in communicating with them. Ultimately, the airline is responsible to you for any loss or inconvenience you encounter.

Check-In and Embarkation

Getting to Port Everglades

The easiest way to get to the port is by taxi, which are readily available at the Ft. Lauderdale airport. The port is a 10-minute cab ride from the airport, and costs about \$15. Taxis from Miami take about 45 minutes and cost about \$75.

Covered parking is available for a rate of \$15.00 per day.

For driving directions to Port Everglades, please visit our web site, or see your RCCL cruise documents.

Important Check In Time Information

Embarkation begins around 1:00 pm, and we'll start check-in around noon. While the terminal is very large and efficient, remember that we have to process 5500 guests. If you're not arriving on an early morning flight on 6 February, we suggest arriving to the ship anytime between 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm. All guests must be checked in by 4:00 pm.

Unless you enjoy standing in line, we strongly advise arriving after 1:00 pm. You won't miss a thing and you'll be onboard with a minimum of waiting. Check-in is very fast!

The Allure sails at 5:00 pm sharp on February 6, 2011.

Due to new government regulations requiring cruise lines to submit final departure manifests at least 60 minutes prior to sailing, guests are requested to complete Online Check-in no later than 3 days prior to their cruise. If you have not completed Online Check-in, you will be required to complete this process at the pier at least 90 minutes prior to the published sailing time

Please note that you must be at the pier no later than 4:00 pm or you may be denied boarding.

What do I Need to Check In?

Since your reservation is completely electronic, all you need is a valid passport and valid credit card to check in for this cruise. You will then be issued a *SeaPass* card, which will serve as your room key and identification card for boarding and re-boarding the ship.

Upon arrival to the port, you will check in, pass through security and your luggage will be transferred by porters to your stateroom. Please carry any documents and valuables in your hand luggage.

If you have created an *SetSail Pass* on the RCCL web site, check-in will be considerably expedited.

Onboard the Allure

Personal Funds & Shipboard Charges

The currency onboard is U.S. dollars. Royal Caribbean ships operate on a cashless system. You can validate your Royal Caribbean *SeaPass* card with your Visa, MasterCard, Novus, or American Express card, or sign for payment by cash or traveller's check. Guests can then sign all onboard services and purchases to their account. At the end of the cruise, you will receive a completely itemized statement.

For your convenience, the ship has an onboard ATM machine that dispenses U.S. currency. Bank debit cards on the PLUS and CIRRUS networks are accepted along with the following credit cards: American Express, Discover/Novus, MasterCard and VISA. Fees will be charged per transaction.

Room Features

The rooms on the Allure are truly state-of-the art, with a few features not found on other ships. The ship has both 110 (US standard) and 220 (European) voltage power outlets in the rooms. All the water onboard is filtered and potable.

Each stateroom is equipped with a hair dryer.

Each room also has a dock for your iPod or iPhone, with built-in speakers and an alarm clock.

There is a very sophisticated interactive TV system in every room, offering a wide range of on-demand movies, as well as Atlantis programming and popular satellite channels. In addition, you can use the interactive features to review your account, order room service, reserve show tickets and excursions, and plan out your cruise. We recommend familiarizing yourself with this system as soon as you embark as it can save hours of standing in line!

Customs & Immigration at Sea

Upon embarkation in Ft. Lauderdale and at each port of call, customs and immigration officials will inspect our guests and the ship. They must clear it before we are allowed to go ashore. Normally, this occurs without your knowledge or participation. Occasionally, passengers are called for inspection. In these cases, please follow the instructions provided to assure that we are able to disembark in a timely manner in each port.

While we shouldn't have to say this, please don't even think of bringing any type of illegal substance, hazardous material, or other items that are banned by customs or ship security.

Guest Conduct Policy

Please remember that all our guests are bound by Royal Caribbean's Guest Conduct Policy. The policy is intended to help ensure that all guests are able to participate in a safe and enjoyable cruise experience and sets forth standards of conduct for guests to follow throughout their vacation. Alcoholic Beverage Restrictions

Royal Caribbean International reserves the right to limit or refuse alcoholic beverages to be brought aboard the ship for consumption during your cruise vacation. Any alcohol placed in checked baggage or carried on will be removed and destroyed. Alcohol purchased onboard or in port will be held in secure storage and delivered to your stateroom on the last night of the cruise.

You may not bring any alcohol onboard upon embarkation.

Please note that this is a standard policy of all cruise ships sailing today.

Shore Excursions

You can pre-book shore excursions in advance on the RCCL website (royalcaribbean.com) until February 2nd. Upon arrival to the ship, you will receive tickets for your pre-booked excursions in your stateroom.

You may purchase additional shore excursions onboard, subject to availability, at the Shore Excursions Desk. You may also book shore excursions through your TV set using the RCTV system in your room.

Atlantis has worked closely with RCCL to enhance and develop excursions that will be fun and exciting for our group. Many of the excursions are "exclusive" to Atlantis guests, although in some cases the tours may be mixed with guests from other cruise ships. If you are in doubt, please inquire with Shore Excursions before booking.

Laundry & Dry Cleaning Services

Laundry, dry cleaning, spot removal and pressing services are available for an additional fee. Laundry bags and service request forms are in your room. Ask your cabin steward for details.

There are no irons in staterooms as they constitute a fire hazard. There are also no self-service laundry facilities onboard.

Gratuities and Tipping

All standard gratuities have been prepaid for this week, so there is no tipping required or expected at any time. All cabin stewards, waiters, and other personnel have been compensated at levels that are customary for a charter of this size. No additional tipping is needed but may be extended at your discretion if the service is exceptional.

A 15% gratuity is automatically added to all bar purchases and spa service charges.

Smoking Policy

For the comfort of all of our guests, designated smoking and non-smoking areas are available throughout the vessel. All dining areas are non-smoking. All showrooms are non-smoking. Smoking is permitted only in certain lounge areas and on open decks. As a courtesy to our guests, ship personnel will thoroughly enforce the smoking policy.

Additionally, Studio B and Blaze will be designated as non-smoking lounges during all

nighttime party events. No smoking is allowed in the Solarium at any time as well.

Please note that Atlantis and/or RCCL reserves the right to change the smoking policy at any time depending on guest requirements. A complete detail of the smoking areas onboard can be found in your stateroom upon embarkation in the *Cruise Compass*.

Suite Privileges

All guests in a Grand Suite or higher category will be entitled to several unique and valuable VIP services on the Allure. Full details will be provided upon embarkation, but here are a few of the highlights:

- Concierge Lounge Access. You'll have exclusive access to the fabulous concierge lounge on deck 11, with the best view of the boardwalk for breakfast, lunch, and evening cocktails. Our trained concierges will assist you with virtually all of your reservation needs, including restaurants and shows.
- Gold Card Access and Priority Seating for Main Shows. There's no need to reserve show tickets, just show your gold card up to 10 minutes prior to showtime and you'll walk right in! Also, we hold limited priority seating for our suite guests up until 15 minutes before the show starts.
- Advance Specialty Restaurant Reservations. Each suite room is allowed to make up to 3 advance bookings for this cruise at our specialty restaurants. See the Concierge for assistance.

If You Have a Problem or Question

Both the Guest Relations Desk and the Atlantis Information Desk can handle most any difficulty you may encounter. Generally, issues relating to your stateroom, the ship, schedules, or billing should be directed to the Guest Relations Desk. Questions regarding entertainment, service, Atlantis policies, special requests, or anything else should be directed to the Atlantis Desk. Questions about excursions should go directly to the Shore Excursions Desk.

If the Atlantis Desk is unattended, please feel free to ask any Team Atlantis member and we will happily assist you.

Spa Services

The *Allure* features an exceptional full-service spa, offering a wide range of services including massage, facial, aromatherapy, hairstyling, and much more. Appointments for these services should be made early in your cruise, as many of the services book up early. All spa services are an additional charge which can be signed to your stateroom.

You can book spa appointments for all our port days online now. Spa appointments for our sea days will be available on Sunday afternoon, immediately following the boat drill, in order to be fair to all our guests. The spa will be open earlier that day for tours and same-day appointments.

Medical Services

Should you require medical attention while on board, an infirmary staff is available to assist you 24 hours a day. A doctor is available to render services at a customary charge. The infirmary is capable of providing treatment for minor matters which may arise during your cruise and are capable of assessing and stabilizing most medical emergencies. Should you require treatment for a serious condition which requires hospitalization, then arrangements may be made to transfer you to a medical facility ashore. While at sea, the ability to transfer you to a shore side facility may be limited or delayed by weather or logistical considerations. If you are currently suffering from a serious medical condition, please consult with your personal physician prior to sailing. Royal Caribbean's doctors are independent contractors..

Important Health Notice -- Please Read!

If you should come down with a contagious disease, or even suspect a contagious disease, it's compulsory that you report it to the ship's infirmary for the safety of everyone on board. Should you be on any medication, or want the medical staff to be aware of any special needs, please contact the infirmary. This will ensure that they will be prepared should you need assistance.

In rare instances, the ship's medical staff may determine that your medical condition will require you to be quarantined in your stateroom to protect the health of our other guests. While both RCCL and Atlantis will make every effort to make you comfortable in such a situation, we are unable to compensate lost vacation time due to quarantine.

Please note that the ship follows C.D.C. guidelines on all quarantine issues, and there is little flexibility in applying the rules, particularly where gastrointestinal symptoms are present.

As always, we highly recommend travel insurance to assist with unforeseen costs and reimbursement for missed vacation time due to illness of any type. If you do not have travel insurance, it can be purchased virtually right up to departure time.

Atlantis Cruise Essentials

Team Atlantis & Information Desk

Our Team Atlantis is on hand throughout the ship to host and assist with every aspect of your vacation. Please don't hesitate to ask any of us if you have a question or require assistance. We are available 24 hours a day, and are always wearing Atlantis name badges.

We also offer a general information desk located on Deck 5 adjacent to the Guest Relations Desk. Hours for this desk vary by port and are posted in the *Cruise Compass*.

Atlantis management can also be reached through Guest Relations at any time.

Atlantis Roommate Share Program

If you are participating in our roommate share program, you have been assigned a roommate based on smoking preferences. Your roommate's name may appear on your confirmation, but is subject to change. This program is offered as a convenience and service for our single travelers, and as such no roommate changes are permitted for any reason whatsoever.

Upon arrival, you will find a detailed letter in your stateroom with advice on how best to enjoy your cruise together.

Special Events for Singles

We host several special events throughout the week for our single guests, ranging from cocktail parties to special dinners. Please see the *Cruise Compass* for information on specific events.

Atlantis Cruise Compass

The Atlantis version of Royal Caribbean's *Cruise Compass* will be delivered to your stateroom each night with a complete schedule for the following day. All activities, shows, and function times are described in this newsletter and handy pocket card. Please remember that this is our primary method of communicating with you, so read it daily. Changes and/ or updates from our original schedule are common during a cruise, particularly in case of inclement weather.

The entire cruise compass can also be found throughout the ship on the WayFinder video screens in elevator lobbies on each floor. You can also find it on your stateroom's television.

You can also find out what's going on by watching Malcolm and Allan, our two cruise directors, on their daily TV broadcast. It's the most informative 10 minutes of your day!

As always, Atlantis features open seating at all meals. We believe that sharing a meal with friends, including new friends you meet at the table, is a highlight of every Atlantis cruise.

Dining Notes

Please note that all restaurants are smoke-free.

All dining times are approximate, and will change slightly according to our port times and onboard events. All dining options are listed in the *Cruise Compass*.

Updated restaurant capacity information is available on the WayFinder monitors throughout the ship. We highly recommend using these to avoid waiting in line.

Team Atlantis members will be on hand at the main restaurant during dinner to seat you, answer questions, and host tables. We always encourage you to join other guests for meals -- it's the best way to meet people! We will do our best to honor special seating requests.

Please be patient during peak hours as there may be a slight wait in the main restaurant. We recommend dining before 8 pm or after 9 pm to avoid any waiting in line. We have scheduled everything to allow you to enjoy a show either before or after a meal.

Room service is available 24 hours a day (charges apply during some hours). See the menu in your stateroom or interactive TV for a complete selection and ordering instructions. Please recognize that the staff handling room service has limited capabilities. If you're looking for a quick snack, we highly recommend the Windjammer Cafe, Cafe Promenade, or Sorrento's which are all open almost 24-hours a day.

Specialty Restaurant & Reservations

Royal Caribbean offers several distinctive and original dining experiences onboard the *Allure*. There are three terrific restaurants on Central Park: Chops is an authentic steak house, with an open kitchen and warm clubby decor, Giovanni's Table features superb Italian food in a relaxed trattoria setting, and the jewelbox-like 150 Central Park offers a brilliant and original multi-course tasting menu. For a real taste of Brazil, head to Samba Grill, our original churrascaria. Rita's Cantina on the Boardwalk is sure to be a hit with a fantastic margarita menu and regional Mexican specialities. And Izumi offers sushi and other Asian specialities in a casual, open setting -- satisfying your cravings until 1 am!

Reservations for all of these restaurants are strongly encouraged, and may only be made for same day dining. In fairness to all our guests, reservations must be made in person or by phone each day, and only one reservation per stateroom will be accepted daily. These restaurants are not equipped to handle parties larger than eight guests (and only a few tables are this size), and no larger party reservations will be accepted. Please respect these policies so that the maximum number of our guests may enjoy these unique dining experiences.

Suite (Grand and above) guests may reserve in advance for up to three total visits per room during the cruise through the Concierge.

An extra fee applies for all specialty restaurants. Gratuities are included.

Finally, please respect that we have limited space in these restaurants and a lot of guests who want to enjoy them. If your plans change, please cancel your booking in a timely manner so that we can accommodate another guest. Also, please respect your original request in terms of table size (don't show up with 8 guests when you book for 4!). Thank you.

Special Occasions

We are at your service for any special celebration! Whether it's a birthday, anniversary, or other event, we want to make it memorable! Please see either an Atlantis or Royal Caribbean team member and we'll do our best to make it unforgettable.

Singles Dining

Traveling solo doesn't mean you have to eat alone. Whenever you enter the main restaurant, our Team Atlantis will graciously seat you with our other guests. Also, we're creating several special singles dinners, along with a designated meeting place for single guests to gather for drinks before dinner every night. Special Diets

We ask that you submit any special dietary requests in writing directly to Royal Caribbean at least one week prior to sailing. Once onboard, please speak with the Maitre D' of the restaurant regarding any special requests.

Please note that since this cruise is "open seating", it is your responsibility to notify the server and/or Maitre D' of any special requests you have made every time you dine.

Vegetarian and low fat options are available at each meal.

Our Advice on Dining

The Allure truly presents more options than any other ship in terms of dining, but there are also some challenges due to the number of guests we serve. Here are a few simple tips we've learned from spending time on the ship over the past few months:

- **Dine early or late in the main restaurant**. Try going to the early show and having dinner at 9 pm. You'll see a great show, not be rushed for dinner, and still be able to enjoy all our evening festivities.!
- **Shop around for breakfast**. There's usually a huge pile-up of people in the Windjammer around 9:30 am for breakfast, all with plates and few with tables. So try some of the other great options. The main restaurant has a quick buffet plus full service dining, Park Cafe has a terrific Bagel Bar and breakfast sandwiches, and Johnny Rockets serves a wonderful "diner-style" full-service breakfast at no additional charge!
- Watch the screens. The "WayFinder" monitors near ever elevator bank have updated and accurate information on how busy every restaurant is. Ten seconds there can save you 15 minutes of walking and frustration.
- **Be flexible**. You might not get the reservation you want, but in our experience we're able to handle a lot of walk-ins for the specialty restaurants, especially late. Just ask.
- Have lunch at Giovanni's Table. It's the best deal on the ship at \$10!

Showtime on Allure

How it Works

Atlantis and Royal Caribbean are presenting more productions, acts, and cabaret shows this week than have ever been seen on a cruise ship in 7 days. We're literally tripling the number of performances that they have on a "standard" cruise! That said, it's a little different than any cruise you've seen and requires a bit of planning. Here's how it all works.

Instead of one single theater space, we now have three. On any given night you might be in the Amber Theater, Aqua Theater, or Studio B for a show.

We repeat all our performances enough that around 80% of our guests can possibly see every show. While it's possible to see every performance offered during the week, we've designed more shows than nights and more entertainment to cover more tastes than ever before.

We recommend planning your week with your friends prior to making any show reservations. It's much easier to do it all at once than make a lot of changes during the cruise.

Show Reservations and Tickets

In order to control our capacities and help you plan your cruise, the main venues will use electronic ticketing for most performances. All shows are, of course, free. There is no physical ticket -- your SeaPass card serves as your electronic entry and is scanned at our doors. You'll have a guaranteed space up until 10 minutes prior to showtime. Making a reservation is easy and can be done in one of the following three ways:

- Online until Feb 2. You may reserve tickets online at RCCL.com for all performances until 11:59 pm, EST on February 2, 2011. You may also cancel and/or change reservations using this system.
- On your stateroom TV. Once onboard, the interactive system in your stateroom will let you book show tickets as well as review and revise your original choices.
- At the Box Office. We'll set up several "box office" stations throughout the ship where you can book and modify show reservations. This is the best place to make reservations for large groups. Locations and hours vary daily and will be listed in the Cruise Compass.

We are currently putting about 80% of the available inventory for every show online, so if you're not able to get exactly what you want, please check onboard for updated availability.

Finally, if your plans change and you're not able to go to a particular performance, please take a minute and cancel your reservation. That small, courteous act will probably make someone else very happy. Thank you.

Walk-In and Standby Options

We will always operate a waiting line for our walk-in and standby guests outside each show. Ten minutes prior to showtime, we'll release all reservations and bring in as many standby guests as possible.



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After Your Cruise

Arrival into Ft. Lauderdale

Upon arriving into Ft. Lauderdale after your cruise, we will begin disembarkation around 7 am. This procedure generally takes two hours. If you have a flight earlier than 10 am, please notify Royal Caribbean onboard and we'll do our best to prioritize your departure.

After leaving the vessel you may claim your luggage on the pier. Baggage lost or damaged must be reported to Royal Caribbean prior to leaving the baggage claim area.

Airport Transfers to FLL or MIA

Royal Caribbean will offer group transfers to both the Ft. Lauderdale and Miami airports onboard during your cruise. Rates and information will be sent to your stateroom during the cruise, or inquire at the Guest Relations Desk.

If you are going directly to the airport upon arrival into Ft. Lauderdale, we strongly recommend purchasing the Royal Caribbean transfers. Taxis are available, but the bus is a lot easier and faster...

Friends and family can reach you 24 hours a day via Royal Caribbean's Satellite Service. Have them call 888-724-SHIP (7447) from the USA, or 1-732-335-3285 from the rest of the world. The cost is \$7.95 per minute and can be billed to their American Express, MasterCard, or Discover cards. (From outside the USA, additional long distance charges will apply).

Internet Access - Royal Caribbean Cruises Online

The *Allure* is completely wired for internet access throughout the ship. An additional charge applies, of course, and packages are available. There are only a few public computers onboard, so we recommend bringing your own laptop if you need internet access..

Remember that internet access at sea is much slower than broadband access. After all, you do have to go through a satellite link!

Finally, we recommend turning all mobile broadband devices to "Airplane Mode" while onboard. They tend to hold onto an IP address that another user could be utilizing.
